**Rug Hooking Class – Minnetonka Art Center:** This course is an opportunity to learn the art of primitive rug hooking. You have the option to choose the project you wish to hook, or you may bring your own design. The course will cover transferring a pattern to linen or monks cloth; color planning the project with wool you bring, or wool provided by the instructor; cutting or tearing the wool into strips; basic rug hooking instructions; proddy, waldoboro and other techniques that add interest to the project; and a variety of ways to finish the project. No prior experience is required, everyone can learn to hook. At the end of the course you will have a beautiful, one of a kind hooked piece.
